Dear Member,

Firethorn Greens

We are as disappointed as you are about the appearance of our Firethorn greens. There are brown patches and apparent damage to the grass and there are understandably questions as to how this happened.

So, how did this happen? In preparation for the Joburg Open, we started our usual regime of fertilising the greens and managing weeds on the course. In particular, we sprayed Mancozeb on Tuesday, 9 November to combat the "fairy rings" on the greens. The first greens sprayed were the chipping and putting green. By Thursday afternoon the greens started showing stress which progressively got worse over the weekend. Watering them and cooling them down had no effect.

We often use Mancozeb as part of our spraying programme to take care of disease and would have used it regardless of whether we had a tournament or not. We have never experienced any damage using this product and had complete confidence that it would not cause damage. We even used the product when we redid the Firethorn greens in 2015. We sprayed it on seedlings with no adverse effect. Unfortunately, this time recovery has been slow.

Once the tournament is over, Management and the General Committee will investigate in detail how this happened, who is responsible and, most importantly, how do we prevent a recurrence.

There are however a lot of questions as to what needs to be done to restore the greens. An early assessment of the greens indicates that we will have to firstly hollowtine the greens, which we do in December every year in any case. In areas where the grass will not recover by itself in the near future, we will then have to seed and plug so that the new grass may be encouraged to take root again. This will be done as soon as possible after the tournament, so that we may take advantage of the lower traffic in the holiday season. It is difficult to predict how long this may take, as it depends on weather and soil conditions. We believe that the greens will have made significant progress in the next two months, and we will be monitoring the situation closely to ensure that we get back to normal playing conditions as soon as possible.

In addition to the above, we have a bag of the product that will be sent for testing. Soil samples will also be done to pick up any residue, and hopefully point us to the root cause of the problem.

We will be communicating regularly to you on the progress that we are making, and in the meantime we will appreciate your patience and understanding.
